world-wide an estimated 100 billion tonnes of topsoil have been lost to erosion

 atmospheric build-up of toxic chemical pollutants is rapidly depleting our protective ozone layer causing a greenhouse effect and drastic changes to weather patterns

 useful bio-degradable materials are wasted daily instead of being hygienically composted as a valuable resource to make humus for soil revitalisation and tree propagation

world population is increasing steadily while food production in many areas is at crisis point
 oceans and inland waterways are so polluted that much of the aquatic life is unable to be sustained

the world's wildlife and many plant species are in continuing decline

deserts are spreading rapidly and encroaching on agricultural areas
short-term economic gains are considered more important than the future of our home planet
global military spending is now over \$1 trillion per year (\$2 million per minute)
24 people (18 of them children), die every minute from hunger and poverty-related diseases
most of the world's people are overfed, yet suffering from malnutrition due to devitalised foods

What it means to us all . . .

As we are totally dependent on Mother Earth for our survival, a fundamental change is needed in our relationship with, understanding of, and respect for the Earth and its natural resources.

Who is responsible \dots

Everyone. Individuals, community groups, businesses, corporations and Governments must all be responsible and DO something before it is too late - and the time for action is NOW.

What INDIVIDUALS can do:

plant and grow trees wherever and whenever possible

separate all recycleable household refuse and support all local council recycling efforts
develop a sense of humus and hygienically compost all your presently-wasted organic, bio-degradable materials into soil and set up an organic food garden in your backyard
insist on organically-grown food and environmentally-sound packaging
seek out alternatives to rainforest timbers for building materials

organise and/or support local community earth repair action groups

respect areas of beauty by not littering or damaging
use recycled paper and other recycled materials where possible

 only use household products which are safe for the environment conserve valuable resources such as water and electricity

organise car pools to help reduce damaging exhaust emissions

send letters and petitions to your politicians and the media about taking Earth Repair Action
know that your voice is effective and be optimistic about the future for humanity

What LOCAL COUNCILS can do:

organise local tree-planting projects
create permanent, self-sustaining and organic public food parks
encourage backyard composting and household gardening
responsibly manage waste materials and organise recycling depots
circulate educational material for school and community use to foster individual responsibility for earth repair action
clean up local areas of beauty and encourage pollution controlmotivate greater use of public transport

What GOVERNMENTS can do:

STOP irresponsible logging and begin major tree-growing projects NOW
establish soil manufacturing plants to hygienically compost all presently-wasted bio-degradable, valuable resource materials, such as organic household refuse, sewage by-products and fine-ground mineral-rich rock-dust from some mining sites, for use in revitalising soils
reallocate annually 10% of all military budgets to fund a ten year earth repair action plan
utilise available resources such as military personnel and equipment to help grow billions of trees to replace forests lost, and to replenish the atmosphere
protect all remaining native forests flora and wildlife

protect all remaining native forests, flora and wildlife
strictly control pollution in industrial and city areas

encourage community participation in establishing permanent, self-sustaining, organic agriculture, and food parks and gardens in cities, schools and prisons

discourage the misuse of chemical fertilisers on our foodcrops
