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"Correlation Committee Data: Principal Ideas Covered in Thirty-Five Group Meetings in 1941-42."

Introduction

Since experiencing the contradictions in the depression, general strike, and vigilante raids reviewed in SEP No. 48, I was searching for a better understanding of human society. Books representative but not necessarily the exact sources for some of my studies in the period 1929-1941 are given in SEP No. 49.

My questions were accentuated by the shock of experiencing library censorship at the Berkeley Public Library (SEP No. 51). Also the failure of popular economic and political theories raised further questions as to how the businessman could be provided some advance feedback from the future to enable him to make better decisions.

During the period 1936-40, I attended some discussion groups at the University YMCA and the Unitarian Church. I also attended the annual YMCA-YWCA Regional Inter-Collegiate Conferences at Asilomar during the week between Christmas and New Years Day. In addition I took a course on the Prophet Isaiah from Dr. Muilenberg, Pacific School of Religion, and a short series of lectures on the "We" Psychology by Dr. Fritz Kunkel, also of P.S.R.




Fig 1. Out posts of Social Progress.

Some of my ideas of 1937 are preserved in SEP No. 52 on "Why I Decided to Become an Electrical Engineer". By the summer of 1940 I felt that the ideas brought up by speakers at various church and Y groups ought to fit into some coherent pattern. My first attempt at a classification system for such ideas is shown in Fig. 1 of this note. A refinement of this chart is reproduced on the cover page of SEP No. 1. This chart was used in planning the 1940-41 series of meetings for Channing Club in Berkeley.

Due to developments in World War II I did not stay in Berkeley the full academic year.

Correlation Committee

In the Fall of 1941, I had an opportunity to follow these concepts further in Boston by setting up a Correlation Committee to tabulate the important points brought out by speakers and in discussions at the Gannett Club, Arlington St. Church. The results of this study are listed in Table I. Instead of working from a chart like Fig. 1, a copy of Table I was cut up into small pieces which were sorted and arranged by subject to see if there could be a possible arrangement like the periodic table of the elements from chemistry which might indicate the extent of coverage of the important problems of our civilization. A model "skyscraper" was built out of erector parts. The ideas were then glued in place on the erector "skyscrapper" with a classification system like that of Fig. 1 in SEP No. 1.
